



BOUQUETS FOR YOU

an original pattern by Diana McClun and Laura Nownes



Class Description

Large pieced urns overflow with an abundance of flowers, vines and leaves. Easy piecing and simple shapes with raw edge machine appliqué make this an appropriate pattern for any experienced beginner.

Class Supply List

- Pattern
- Fabric: refer to the back of the pattern for yardage requirements
- Cutting tools: mat, rotary cutter and acrylic ruler
- Sewing machine, in good working order
- Thread in neutral color, 100% cotton for piecing with bobbin of the same
- Thread in colors to match appliqué shapes
- One sheet of template plastic
- Fine-line permanent pen
- Light-color flannel or sheet (approx. 1-1/2 yd.) to use as a design wall
- Pins
- Seam ripper
- Ziploc bags for storing cut pieces

Class Outline

Six 2-1/2 hour classes with teacher demonstrations and sewing time for students

- Class One:** Cut fabric pieces and begin construction of urns. – pages 1 - 2
Complete urns at home and cut the background pieces.
- Class Two:** Join the background pieces to complete the urn block. – page 3
Begin cutting fabric for the vines, leaves and flowers and prepare for appliqué with the fusible web.
Finish preparing the shapes at home.
- Class Three:** Position the appliqué shapes and begin fusing and then stitching to the background fabric. pages 3-4
Complete the appliqué shapes at home.
- Class Four:** Cut strips and begin constructing the checkerboard and striped borders. – page 4
Complete the checkerboard and striped borders at home
- Class Five:** Cut background strips, vines, leaves and circles for the vine border – page 4
Begin fusing and appliquéing the shapes onto the background strips.
Complete the vine borders at home.
- Class Six:** Assembly – begin sewing all of the sections together
Complete the final assembly at home.

Teachers: Consider having a week or two between classes to allow enough time for homework. For ease of final construction, have the students straighten and trim the edges of all of the blocks and borders before joining them together.
